Goals and format

Please send me your contributions one week in advance. I will then forward them to all participants. In case you do not circulate a self-contained paper but a chapter of your dissertation, please add one or two paragraphs, which locate the chapter in the overall context of the dissertation.

The paper giver should prepare a concise presentation of the main arguments and/or findings of the paper. Given that all participants are expected to have read the text, the presentation may not take longer than 15 minutes. The author’s presentation is followed by a – at maximum – 15 minutes discussion of the discussant, which will be followed by a general discussion in which all those present are invited to participate.
