## Colloquium description

The colloquium serves for proposal defenses for early-stage fellows and presentation of ongoing research of more advanced fellows (cohorts 2018, 2017, 2016). Presenters are asked to hand in their papers one week in advance or at least on Thursday the week before the presentation. Presentations should not exceed 30 minutes. Typically, presentations will get a short comment by an expert faculty member or a fellow and, in case of proposal defenses, by one of the supervisors who are asked to be present for the respective defenses. Comments and replies are to be followed by an open discussion with the audience (the rule 'fellows first' applies!).
